#### 28. Left Hand of God

#### Introduction

Vertical verses in a horizontal book like Proverbs demand our attention.<sup>86</sup> Note Proverbs 21:1 in the several translations given below.

- 21:1The king's heart [is] in the hand of the LORD, [as] the rivers of water: he turneth it whithersoever he will. KJV
- 21:1 The king's heart is in the hand of Jehovah as the watercourses: He turneth it whithersoever he will. ASV
- 2:1 The king's heart is [like] channels of water in the hand of the LORD; He turns it wherever He wishes. NASB
- 21:1 The king's heart is in the hand of the LORD; he directs it like a watercourse wherever he pleases. NIV
- 21:1 The king's heart [is] in the hand of the LORD, [Like] the rivers of water; He turns it wherever He wishes. NKJV
- 21:1 The king's heart is a stream of water in the hand of the LORD; he turns it wherever he will. RSV
- 21:1 The Lord controls rulers, just as he determines the course of rivers. CEV
- 21:1 The Lord controls the mind of a king as easily as he directs the course of a stream. TEV
- 21:1 The king's heart is like a stream of water directed by the Lord; he turns it wherever he pleases. NLT

The terms used—rivers, watercourses, channels, stream, course could refer to a canal or channel of water such as an irrigation ditch. Just as the farmer directs the irrigation ditch so as to bring water where he wants it, so God directs kings and other rulers to do what He wants done.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>86</sup> Psalms is a vertical book. That is, most of the Psalms are dealing with humans talking and/or hearing from God (vertical communication). Proverbs is dealing for the most part with humans relating to each other (horizontal relationships or activity). So then in a book dealing with horizontal relationships or activity it behooves us to note those few vertical passages. They demand our attention.

Every missionary better learn this verse and its view of God very quickly. For missionaries operate in countries controlled by others. They must abide by decisions made by political rulers—usually not in favor of their being in the country. Missionaries learn to trust God to move in the affairs of these pagan rulers.

# Glasser Phrase

Dr. Arthur Glasser uses the phrase, the *Left Hand of God*, to call attention to God's use of non-believers to accomplish His purposes. This *Left Hand of God* is seen numerous times in the Old Testament. Table Hab 28-1 depicts just a few of them.

### **Restoration Leaders**

All the restoration leaders were very much aware of the Left Hand of God. They were rebuilding the work of God back in the land. They were there because God had moved in the hearts of pagan rulers, very powerful ones. Those rulers—particularly Cyrus, Darius, Xerxes, Artxerxes—were moved to aid God's people. Esther, Mordecai, Ezra, Nehemiah, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi were all aware of the Left Hand of God.

One of the astounding things is God's prediction that He will use these rulers to accomplish His purposes. A beautiful illustration of this is Isaiah's famous passage, Isa 45. Table Hab 28-2 below illustrates just a few of the passages referring to Cyrus.
